Jesus is The Bread of Life

This morning, we plan to partake of the Lord's Supper. In preparation for our observance of it, I have selected a passage located in John 6 where Jesus miraculously fed five thousand men not counting women and children. The next day, Jesus gave His bread of life discourse in which He claimed to be the bread of life or the bread of God who came down from heaven to give life to the world (vv. 32-33). Jesus said, "If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread I shall give is my flesh..." (see verse 51).

In this context Jesus made a controversial and misunderstood statement. "Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day" (vs 54). The Jews would take issue with drinking or the eating of flesh with the blood, but Jesus was not speaking in a literal sense. Taken in the context, it is obvious Jesus was speaking metaphorically of believing in Him, not eating and drinking Him (see esp. verses 35 and 40). And although there seems to be a connection to the Lord's Supper in Jesus' language (and some have made it), He is not speaking of the Lord's Supper, but of His death and that one must believe in Him in order to have eternal life.

Adult Sunday School: God not only saves His people from something including sin and His wrath, He saves them to something including conformation to the image of Jesus Christ and good works.
