The Unrighteous and the Kingdom of God

Paul begins this brief passage (1 Corinthians 6:9-11), "Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God?" The connection between this passage and the one preceding it seems obvious enough. In verses 1-8 Paul rebukes the Corinthians for taking each other to court, calling their actions wrong or "unrighteous" (vs. 8), then in the very next verse says the "unrighteous" will not inherit the kingdom of God.

So, in this passage (vv. 9-11) Paul warns the Corinthians not to continue in unrighteousness. Those who continue in sin or unrighteousness will not inherit the kingdom of God. Paul lists some sins here, but it is significant that he uses nouns, and adjectives – fornicators, idolators, adulterers, etc. He is speaking of people whose lives are characterized by these sins, those who continue in them. Before they were saved, some of the Corinthians lived in these sins! Paul wrote, "And such were some of you." But now since God saved them, they no longer continued in these sins! Praise the Lord!

Adult Sunday School: In John's Gospel we observe the goal toward which the narrative is moving. That goal is the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This goal or ultimate purpose for which Christ came is indicated early in story with the words of John the Baptist, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (see 1:29). In John, this goal or end is referred to as Christ's hour. In Christ's reply to his mother's concern that the wine was gone at a wedding feast they both attended, He said, "My hour has not yet come." (2:4) In the gospel we observe the movement toward that hour in a number of ways.
